In January 2018, OAGS started running a **Concurrent Disorders Group** designed for clients who are struggling with depression and/or anxiety as well as a substance use problem. This treatment group uses Cognitive Behaviour Therapy (CBT) skills to help clients reduce and prevent symptoms of depression and anxiety while also helping clients change their substance use.

Benefiting from sustainable funding provided through the province's Opioid Strategy, HSN will also be supporting the regional rollout of RAAM clinics across the NE LHIN by coaching and mentoring clinicians in other communities.
