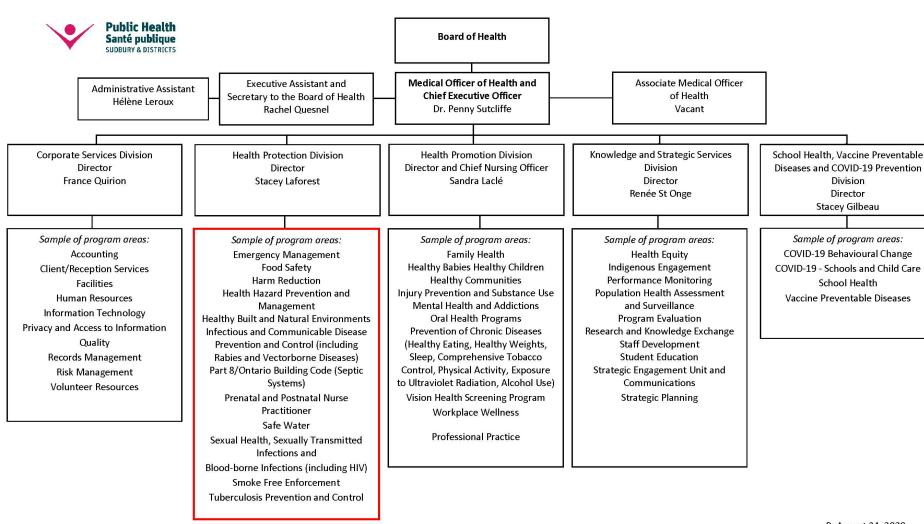

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Infection Prevention and Control

- Infection Prevention and Control (IPAC) refers to evidence-based practices and procedures that, when applied consistently, can prevent or reduce the risk of transmission of microorganisms.
- The Ontario Public Health Standards outlines requirements for Boards of Health to conduct surveillance, inspection, investigations education, enforcement and reporting with respect to IPAC in settings.

IPAC HUBS: Networks of IPAC expertise will:

- decrease number of COVID-19 cases and deaths
- increase quality of life for staff, residents, and families
- improve IPAC preparedness with a prevention goal

IPAC Hub accountabilities

- Identify and monitor IPAC training and practice needs of congregate living settings in our catchment area.
- Strengthen current partnerships and broker new ones.
- Support a network of IPAC service providers and experts.
- Align local resources to meet IPAC needs within congregate setting for prevention and response.
