To: All employers and persons responsible for a business that is open within the service area of Public Health Sudbury & Districts

Re: Workplace COVID-19 vaccination policies strongly recommended—with the support of the Public Health Sudbury & Districts' COVID-19 Workplace Vaccine Toolkit

Thank you for your continued dedication to following individual protective and public health measures to prevent the spread of COVID-19 in your workplaces and in our communities. It is through collective efforts and many sacrifices that the Sudbury and Manitoulin districts have benefited from relatively low rates of COVID-19 cases to date.

You will be aware of the sobering news that Fall 2021 is expected to bring with it the risk of a fourth wave of COVID-19 with the more transmissible and dangerous Delta variant dominating. The good news is that we have ready access to effective COVID-19 vaccines that will reduce the seriousness of a fourth wave.

We are aiming high so we can stay low. More than 90% of eligible individuals need to be vaccinated so we can keep COVID-19 cases low. Workplaces are an essential part of the vaccination solution. To be very clear, workplace practices and policies are critical to encourage vaccine uptake among employees—protecting clients, customers, and livelihoods.

As an employer it's your responsibility under the *Occupational Health* and *Safety Act* to take every precaution reasonable in the circumstances to protect a worker. Under the <u>O. Reg. 364/20</u>: Rules for Areas at Step 3 and at the Roadmap Exit Step, persons responsible for a business that is open shall prepare and make available a written <u>COVID-19 safety plan</u>.

As the region's Medical Officer of Health, I am strongly recommending all area employers and persons responsible for a business that is open within the service area of Public Health Sudbury & Districts develop and implement a COVID-19 vaccination policy.

We will do our best to accommodate community requests as capacity and timing allow.
