This Letter of Instructions amends and replaces my earlier Instructions issued September 29, 2021, and effective October 14, 2021

To: Persons responsible for Facilities Located in Public Health Sudbury & Districts Jurisdiction¹ Where Organized Sport(s) are Played and/or Practiced Indoors

Re: Public Health Instructions for Owners/Operators

I am writing to notify owners, operators and permit holders for the above Facilities of your responsibilities.

I also wish to thank you for your ongoing support throughout the COVID-19 pandemic to help protect the health of area residents. It is through our collective efforts that we will keep our communities safe. The fourth wave of the COVID-19 pandemic is upon us, with the highly transmissible Delta variant being the dominant variant in COVID-19 cases. The Ontario's Science Advisory and Modelling Consensus Tables advise that the Delta Variant is twice as transmissible than the original SARS-CoV-2 virus. Daily COVID-19 case counts in Ontario are substantial, with provincial data showing over 3,444 new cases reported to public health during the period of November 03 to November 09, 2021, with a rate of 23.3 per 100,000 population.

On Friday, November 5, 2021, Public Health Sudbury & Districts reached a milestone of over 3000 cases of COVID-19 reported since the onset of the pandemic. As of Tuesday, November 9, 2021, there are 3,155 reported cases in the health unit service area. With 263 cases currently active, Public Health Sudbury & Districts is recording the highest rate of active cases amongst Ontario's 34 health units and the highest we've seen since April 2020. The 14-day rate of new cases (incidence rate) for the period ending November 6 is significantly higher than that of the next highest public health unit in Ontario—166.1 per 100,000 vs.102.3 per 100,000.

In the past 7-days, 172 of 246 cases (69.9%) screened positive for variants of concern. Forty-one (16.7%) of the cases were among those under the age of 19.

Activities related to Organized Sport(s) have the potential to enhance COVID-19 transmission. Specifically, close contact, forceful exhalation, prolonged exposure, crowded indoor spaces and masks and face coverings removed during physical activity contribute to enhanced likelihood of COVID-19 transmission. These risks for enhanced transmission are combined with the risk of increased spread within and between communities given the composition of Organized Sport(s) teams and their associated travel. Verifying proof of vaccination for persons 12 years and older in the Facilities noted above, in accordance with this Letter of Instructions, will strengthen protections for communities within the Public Health Sudbury & Districts service area by helping curb the spread of COVID-19.

These instructions are being provided pursuant to Section 2(2.1) of Schedule 1 to <u>OntarioRegulation</u> <u>364/20</u>: Rules for Areas at Step 3 And At The Roadmap Exit made under the Reopening Ontario (A Flexible Response to COVID-19) Act, 2020, S.O. 2020, c. 17 (the "Reopening Ontario Act), formerly a regulation made under the Emergency Management and Civil Protection Act and now a continued section 7.0.2 order under the Reopening Ontario Act. As required by regulation, these instructions are issued following consultation with the Office of the Chief Medical Officer of Health.

Where this Letter of Instructions imposes additional requirements not set out in the *Reopening Ontario Act*, the requirements under this Letter of Instructions must be followed.

I may amend these instructions (if and as required) and will rescind them as soon I determine they are no longer necessary.

These instructions remain in effect until further amended or rescinded by me.

PLEASE FOLLOW ALL INSTRUCTIONS CLOSELY

Effective 12:01 a.m. on November 15, 2021, and until further notice unless otherwise specified, I am instructing all persons responsible for Facilities where Organized Sport(s) are played and/or practiced (including owners, operators and permit holders) to:

 Require each person, age 12 years and older, at the point of entry, who attends the indoor area of the Facility for the purpose of (a) actively playing or otherwise participating directly in Organized Sport(s); (b) coaching, officiating or volunteering in Organized Sport(s); or (c) spectating at Organized Sport(s), to provide identificationand proof of being fully vaccinated against COVID-19 or a valid medical exemption.

All children shall be afforded a "grace period" of 12 weeks from their 12th birthday during which they must provide identification in accordance with these Instructions but are relieved of the requirement to provide proof of being fully vaccinated against COVID-19, to allow a reasonable opportunity for this to be completed.

2. Comply with all other requirements under the *Reopening Ontario Act* and its regulations that apply to the Facility.

Owners/Operators of Facilities Located in Public Health Sudbury & Districts Jurisdiction Where Organized Sports are Played and/or Practiced Indoors

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DEFINITIONS

For the purpose of these instructions:

"Facility" means a facility located in the area served by Public Health Sudbury & Districts where OrganizedSport(s) are played and/or practiced.

"Fully Vaccinated" is as defined within Section 2.1(5) of Schedule 1 to <u>Ontario Regulation</u> <u>364/20</u>: Rules for Areas at Step 3 And At The Roadmap Exit Step made under the Reopening Ontario Act.

"**Owner/Operator**" means an owner/operator of a facility located in Public Health Sudbury & Districts where organized sports are played and/or practiced.

"Organized Sport(s)" means organized sport(s) and recreational fitness activities including, but not limited to, sports leagues, organized pick-up sports, dance classes, gymnastics, martial arts and swimmingclasses, or as otherwise described in the <u>Ministry of Health's Proof of Vaccination Guidance for Businesses and Organizations</u> under the *Reopening Ontario Act* including all related training, practices, games and competitions.

ENFORCEMENT

These instructions will be enforced by public health officials and by provincial offences officers under one or more of the *Health Protection and Promotion Act* (sections 100, 101 and 102), the *Reopening Ontario Act* (sections 9, 9.1, 10 and 10.1) and/or the *Emergency Management and Civil Protection Act* (sections 7.0.5 and 7.0.11). Failure to comply with these instructions is an offence. Among the enforcement actions that may be taken, you may be charged, and penalties imposed including significant fines, imprisonment and/or closure of premises.

A failure to comply with regulations issued under the *Reopening Ontario Act* is an offence punishable by set fines of \$750 for individuals and \$1,000 for corporations under Part I of the *Provincial Offences Act*. Maximum penalties for this offence if prosecuted under Part III of the *Provincial Offences Act* include: for individuals, a fine of up to \$100,000 and imprisonment for not more than one year; for an individual who is an officer or director of a corporation, a fine of up to \$500,000 and imprisonment for not more than one year; and for a corporation, a fine of up to \$10,000,000. A person is guilty of a separate offence on each day that the offence occurs or continues.
