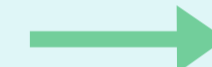

If your first and second vaccines were mRNA vaccines, you can get either mRNA vaccine for your booster dose.

Viral vector vaccines

First OR second doses

Viral vector vaccine
(AstraZeneca Vaxzevria or Janssen/Johnson & Johnson)



Booster dose

mRNA is preferred
(Pfizer-BioNTech Comirnaty or Moderna Spikevax)

If your first and second doses were AstraZeneca or another viral vector vaccine, you should get either mRNA vaccine for your booster dose.

Once you are eligible for your booster dose it is recommended that you get the first available mRNA vaccine, without delay to protect yourself against the Omicron variant. For adult vaccination, Pfizer-BioNTech Comirnaty and Moderna Spikevax vaccines can be safely interchanged.

Individuals 12 to 29 years of age are preferentially recommended to get the Pfizer-BioNTech Comirnaty vaccine. These recommendations are in alignment with the *Ministry of Health Third Dose Recommendations* guidance document and based on evidence of immune protection.
