		Suggested activities to reduce harms and costs for consideration. There is a need to include representation of people with lived and living experience for advocacy. Opioid-dependant people are not the only population using opioids – there's a gap identified in the DSNO verbiage for people who experimentally use recreational drugs. This is a drug poisoning and policy crisis which puts the onus on the government to engage. We must work together to have a united front for a strong voice to ask the government for help.	
6.2	- Opioid Leadership Summit	The fact sheet documents should be shared with the executive committee. We are missing experts at this table to share in the wealth of information. The focus on the summit is building momentum locally (including Manitoulin and surrounding districts) and build outward as early as September 2023. A proposed budget would help plan for ongoing and consistent support throughout our widespread geographic region, such as Honouring Voices Initiative (although this initiative would have a limited scope). There is currently no funding for the leadership summit. The following motion was endorsed: Drug and Policy Crisis Leadership Summit - Fall of 2023.
